I also was invited to give a clinic at his facility. They were exceptionally well prepared and the students were a credit to his teaching abilities. It was very satisfying to see, that Mr. Winkler had been able to transmit, what he had learned from me to his own students. The atmosphere was highly professional and friendly.

I can only hope that whoever has contact with Siegfried Winkler can appreciate him and his capabilities as much as I did. Mr. Winkler was very quick in recognizing the basics faults of the horse and rider in Nizhny Novgorod and immediately developed an extremely successful training program. Mr. Abramov and his students were so very enthusiastic about Mr. Winkler's perceptive training abilities that we decided to travel to Germany in order to attend clinics at his wonderful facility in Heltersberg in Germany. This decision was the key to the success of Abramov's students. For example Alexandra Korelova was the winner of the Russian dressage championship for Young Riders twice, the winner of the Volvo cup and the Eurasia Cup and placed third in a competition for senior riders. The main Russia equestrian press interviewed Mr. Winkler which resulted in an extensive and impressive article about his work.

Mr. Abramov told me at length how much he had appreciated the very professional training sessions with Mr. Winkler and how he had learned to adjust his work routine in order to improve the rhythm and correctness of the movements.


I have known and learned to respect Siegfried Winkler as an extremely competent and professional trainer and teacher of both horse and rider.




To Whom It May Concern:


I was introduced to Siegfried Winkler in 1999 when I purchased my current show horse from him. I was very impressed with his wealth of knowledge and experience in the training of the combination of both the rider & horse in the discipline of dressage (without having to actually ride the horse himself, as is so often done by trainers).

Since then I have been training consistently with Siegfried Winkler whenever he is available to give clinics in the USA. I have noticed a tremendous improvement in my riding abilities and consequently, my horses have, also, tremendously improved in their dressage training. In 2001, I started to compete my young horse, Wishmeister, whom I purchased from Mr. Winkler, and was consistently either winning the class or placed 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> in the class during the entire show season for dressage shows recognized by both the United States Dressage Federation and the American Horse Show Association. For the 2002 shows recognized by both the United States Dressage Federation and the USA Equestrian Association (formerly the American Horse Show Association), we have, also, had many 1<sup>st</sup> place winnings along with winning a few championships. Most recently I and my horse, Wishmeister, were the "United States Dressage Federation Adult Team Region 1 Individual Champion for First Level". This was a regional championship for the USDF Region 1 which consisted of the states: New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia and North Carolina. I have enclosed a copy of a newsletter which refers to this championship. The 2002 Year End Awards have not yet been finalized as of the date of this letter, so any further championships are currently unknown.

Many of my friends have been training with Siegfried Winkler and have, also, experienced a marked improvement in their riding, their horses and in the show ring. As a result of my successes in the show ring, many other competitors have approached me about training with Mr. Winkler.

Siegfried Winkler has knowledge and abilities which are very important to the development & success of dressage in the USA. He has an amazing ability to understand & solve any problem currently being experienced by a horse or rider and consequently improve them both. Any horse & rider combination, who has the opportunity to train with him, will experience a transformation of both their riding and the training of their horse(s).

**Einen Hauch von Turnier-Atmosphäre im Pferdereitsport konnten die Besucher beim dritten „Hoffest“ des Reit- und Fahrclubs Lindenbrunnerhof miterleben. Die Mitglieder um Reitlehrer Siegfried Winkler hatten weder Kosten noch Mühen gescheut, um den interessierten Pferdesportfreunden ein Programm mit hohem Niveau in der Reithalle des Veranstalters zu bieten.**

Clubmitglied Andrea Wagner aus Kröppen eröffnete mit ihrer Voltigiergruppe, bestehend aus zehn Kindern im Alter von zwei bis zwölf Jahren, das Programm. Voltigieren, eine Art Turnen auf dem Pferd, wurde von der Gruppe in einheitlicher Kleidung, gekonnt in Schritt und Trab, durchgeführt. Daß galop-

pierende Pferde auch durch Reifen springen können, bewiesen Christine Wagner und Frau Schütz dem begeisterten Publikum mit einem spielerischen Ritt. Eine Vorstellung mit „höheren Lektionen“ im Damensattel zeigte Dorle Faltejssek aus Ammerbruch (Baden-Württemberg) bei ihrer Reitkür in Heltersberg. Die junge Dame war jahrelang Schülerin in Egon von Neindorfs Reitinstitut in Karlsruhe und bildet jetzt selbst Pferde aus. Mit ihrer mittelbraunen Stute gibt Dorle Faltejssek Showvorführungen in ganz Deutschland, wie kürzlich auf der „Eurocheval“.

Die Vorstellung eines Pferdes auf „Grand-Prix“-Niveau war einer der Höhepunkte beim „Lindenbrunner-Hoffest“. Der „Schultheis-Schüler“ Klaus-Peter Bartels (mehrfacher

Bayerischer Meister) zeigte mit seinem 16jährigen Schimmel „Grandenschatz“ Kostproben seines Könnens. Der imposante Schimmel ging acht Jahre im Sport und hat mehrere Grand-Prix-Siege errungen. Insgesamt kommt das Paar auf 80 Siege in der Dressurklasse S. Hier in Heltersberg gab Klaus-Peter Bartels mit seinem Schimmel „Grandenschatz“ seine letzte offizielle Vorstellung und er wurde dafür mit reichlich Beifall bedacht.

Das Programm vervollständigte Reitlehrer Siegfried Winkler mit dem Dressurpferd „Rafael von Rinaldi“ und einer gekonnten Reitvorstellung. Siegfried Winkler bewies einmal mehr, daß er die verschiedenen Arten der Reiterei perfekt beherrscht und elegant mit Pferd und Musik harmoniert. (git)
